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Dear Parents,

On Monday at Chapel I discussed, making the most of your talents and education, aspirations, and school mottos. A strange selection of topics but bear with me I'll explain the connection between this and a Waihian.

Our chapel was built in 1879, I showed the children a shield which hangs in my office from a school built exactly 500 years earlier in 1379. I told children that this School was founded by a man named William of Wykeham (1320-1404). William was the son of a free but poor man called John Long in Wickham in Hampshire – Southern England.

As a freeman William wouldn't have expected to 'rise above his station' but he did. William went to work in the church and learnt about building. With this education and by using his new-found talents he began to progress. His big break came when he helped with the architectural work for Windsor Castle and eventually got noticed by King Edward III (one of England's most successful monarchs who transformed the country into one of Europe's most formidable powers).

Eventually William became Chancellor of England (second most powerful and wealthy man in England). He founded New College Oxford, New College School in 1379 and Winchester College in 1382. Now my connection with William (apart from our fathers having similar names), was that as a young master my first Prep School teaching position was at New College in Oxford, where the children knew all about William. New College's motto is **Manners Maketh Man**. ~continued over the page~

The children discussed good manners: table manners, saying please and thank you, calling your elders Sir and Ma'am, however this motto goes further than that. The manners William referred to when he first established the motto are those personal "mannerisms" or characteristics, which make up who we are. There is more than a subtle difference, with this motto referring to consideration of others; a sense of fair play; doing the right thing on all occasions; Being beyond moral reproach.

Translated for our children your mannerisms and behavioural characteristics make you who you are. Every child who visits me for an enrolment interview promises to "give everything 100%" and the children know that our only rule is "do the right thing, in the right place, at the right time". That is the Waihi student.

A parent spoke to me one morning and said that her son had remarked to her that (discussing sport) "the one thing you don't want to be called at Waihi is cocky". I thought it was very satisfying that he fully realised that being a Waihian means being humble in victory and gracious in defeat (our children don't always see this role-modelled very well by adults who should know better).

We do discuss our expectations of sporting behaviour with the children, they all 'sign up' to the Waihi Players 'code of conduct'. Staff will be putting these 'codes of conduct' on Class Dojo for you all to see, please take the time to discuss them with your son or daughter. Please also take time to look at the other two 'codes of conduct' that we have, for coaches and supporters. Sport can inflame passions of us all at times but at Waihi we hold our children to the highest of standards and I am sure that all adults associated with Waihi children and teams will support us with our message that *Manners Maketh Man*.

Whether you believe that manners are right at the heart of our personalities or whether you believe that they are more of an external display of a thoughtful state of mind, there is no denying that this proverb can give us plenty of pause for thought. Simply put good manners demonstrate a sense of respect for other human beings.

I look forward to seeing most of you next Friday at our "Meet the Teacher" morning and hope you then stay and enjoy class picnics and Swimming Sports.
