## From the Headmaster's Desk

#### Dear Parents

Last week we welcomed the team from the Education Review Office (ERO) to Waihi School. The visit was part of the normal cycle of reviews by ERO of schools in New Zealand. Our two visitors saw all aspects of the school, during the day and with boarders after school. They even took a keen interest in the results of the Canterbury Chess Championships as the students arrived back last Tuesday!

Although the report will not be published for a few months the team gave verbal feedback to the Leadership team and Board prior to their departure. They were able to offer us a great outside perspective on the school.

Independent School ERO reviews are unlike State School reviews. The reports they write are not evaluative in any way on teaching and learning but are assurance statements regarding the school meeting the standards for registration as a private school in NZ in various areas.

In their verbal feedback to the Board, they described the Waihi curriculum as broad and rich. They noted the wide range of opportunities the students received in cultural areas; drama, music, clubs as well as sport and Outdoor Education in addition to literacy; maths and science. They said that the curriculum is 'lived' (i.e. what we say we are doing we really do it).

They noted that staff had high expectations of the students and that the Board and leadership team had high expectations of the staff. They discussed that in the classroom the students were happy, settled and engaged with learning. They related a couple of small interactions they observed which showed how well teachers know our students. They discussed how actively involved students were in all aspects of the school, and how blessed they are to have the grounds and facilities available to them.


The contribution of our non-teaching staff was commented upon, and they could see what an important role office staff, kitchen staff, matrons, groundsmen played in the lives of our tamariki. They spent time in the boarding house during the evening and were glowing about the pastoral care and the food!

Overall, both reviewers wanted me to thank the staff and the students for a great three days at Waihi. They said everyone at the school was open, relaxed and welcoming. They wanted me to pass this on and to tell everyone just how much they had enjoyed the strong school culture and getting to know just what was happening behind the hedge!


We are pleased to announce Charlotte Steetskamp as the successful candidate, and we are looking forward to her joining our Board.

### Sharing Our Learning I Information

Our first 2 weeks in Stem have just flown by - it has been great to see the students back at school and really engaged in our topics.

The junior classes have been exploring the topic of sound and how this travels - we then made our own music instruments and took these to our music lesson with Mr and Mrs Bradley to perform.

Seniors have been exploring Newton's three laws of motion and testing out Galileo's hypothesis:- if objects are both dropped from the same height they will hit the ground first - this is only true when there is no air causing air resistance. We calculated our speed and determine who was the fastest runner as well.

In Science Badge Club students are busy working away on their topics to gain their badges - some of the challenges are shown including making a bird feeder and recording the birds who visit and constructing a bridge out of Lego to hold 500grams. Fantastic work!

#### CHESS CANTERBURY CHAMPIONSHIPS Tuesday 6 August 2024

On Tuesday 6 August 2024 eleven students travelled to Te Hapua, Halswell, Christchurch to compete in the Canterbury Individual School Championships. The Christchurch chess scene is very active as was evident from the large number of competitors on the day. Everyone played five matches against a variety of individuals in a 'Swiss' competition (this means each round you play someone on similar number of points). It was also the first experience for some of playing in a competition with chess clocks, the time pressure adding another dimension to the games.

The Year 8 players, Otto Acland, Nathan Andrew, Harry Blackman, James Currie, Oscar Elliotte, James Gorrie, Carter Horsley, Ryder Hughes, Leo Jackson and Bentley Roughan, put in very commendable performances, with everyone scoring some draws and wins.

Performance of the day however went to our only junior competing, Fox Mosen. Despite a shock loss in Round Three he bounced back to finish with 4/5 and first place in the Year 6 competition. The last time Waihi had a Canterbury Chess Individual Champion was back in 2018, awesome job Fox!

There will be several social and competitive tournaments in term three and four

for our children to play in. The next event is the Chess Power Regional Event, hosted at Waihi on 19 August. We already have 39 Waihians signed up to participate...it promises to be a fantastic day of chess.

Thank you to Mr Brighouse for accompanying the players to Christchurch as I was tied up hosting the Education Review Office (ERO) team here at Waihi. Mr Brighouse said that Waihi's great sportsmanship and attitude was commented upon by numerous people on the day, well done everyone.
