### Year 8 Visit to South Pacific Sera Laboratories

On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> September the Year 8s had a visit to South Pacific Sera Laboratories in Timaru. The lab specialises in producing animal vaccines and animal blood products. Students were able to view the clean rooms and see the manufacturing process.

Pupils learnt about germs and how we can prevent becoming sick from them. Hands on demonstrations involved using 'Glo paint' to see how clean and well we washed our hands. The 'Glo paint' glows in ultraviolet light showing the spots that were missed with washing. Bacteria agar plates were then passed around to the students showing the types and amount of bacteria growing from different swabs taken around the lab.

A demonstration showed us how tricky it is to put on the clean room garments of gown, mask and eye protection. The aim was not to touch the outside of the garment to avoid cross- contamination when handling the sterile vaccines. Ethan, Grace and Leo then had a go at trying to put the protective clothing on.

The finale of the trip involved a demonstration of the drone produced by 'Aeronavics', based at the labs. It was impressive to see, and we also had a tour of the workshops to see the drones being assembled.



## SANDFORD SCIENCE FAIR Tuesday 6 August 2024

Each year the Year 7s undertake a science investigation of their choosing to produce a science board which is then entered into the Waihi Science Fair. Students choose whether to work on this individually or in partners.

The project allows students to research a topic of interest to them, formulate a question and then to plan and conduct an experiment to prove or disprove a hypothesis that they have made on their subject.

Key skills of researching supporting material, conducting a fair test and identifying variables as well as accurately recording results and analysing and extrapolating data enable students to experience firsthand the skills of being a scientist and communicating their findings to a wider audience.

In our Waihi Science Fair 2024, congratulations go to - **1st place** Katie Rollinson, **2nd** Olivia Copland and Charlotte Rigarlsford, **3rd** Sam Watson and Charlie Dwyer, and highly commended Angus Whillians, Jack France, and Max McLauchlan, and Rosie Bell and Maggie McGregor.

The first three placing from the Waihi Science Fair, along with two year 8 students who chose to complete science fair projects of Harry Blackman and James Gorrie were then entered into the Sandford Science Fair at Timaru and were then judged against entries from other schools. A huge congratulations goes to Charlie Dwyer and Samuel Watson who were awarded bronze at the Sandford Science Fair 2024.

Their project involved investigating 'What type of firewood (beech, pine and blue gum) burns the hottest and longest?". Blue gum was found to burn the longest and the pine the hottest. The conclusion was that hard wood is generally a good wood for burning in overnight fires and soft woods like pine are excellent for giving maximum heat quickly.

This year for 2024 the science fair projects were displayed in the science lab for Grandparents Day and enabled students to show and discuss with their grandparents and visitors their projects.

All the Year 7s are to be acknowledged for their dedication and hard work and effort in producing science boards this year.

# CHESS POWER REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

On Monday 19th August thirty six Waihi students participated in the Timaru/Oamaru Chess Power Regional Tournament hosted at Waihi.

Waihi secured entry to the National finals teams event for both Junior (Y1-6) and Intermediate (Y7/8) competitions and, in addition, six individuals gained an invitation to the 'Champions Trophy' event for top individuals – these competitions take place over the weekend of  $26^{th}$  /  $27^{th}$  October in Wellington.

Fox Mosen went one better than his silver medal last year winning the Junior event with a perfect score of 7/7. William Johnston gaining third place with 5/7. Harry Blackman was second in the Intermediate/Senior Event with 6/7 just half a point behind the winner from Geraldine High School. Carter Horsley, James Gorrie and Nathan Andrew were in a tie for third on 5½/7. Bentley Roughan finished tied for sixth place on 5/7 and due to his result in another Chess Power event in Rotorua, also gained qualification for the National Finals.

Congratulations to everyone who competed on the day.
