This was an extremely difficult decision to reach both professionally and personally. Kendra and I care deeply about the Waihi family and will not forget the love and support which we have felt from our community over the last thirteen years. We know that Own and Lachie had a fantastic start to their education here, whilst Evie and Leilani consider themselves honorary Waihians, just missing the co-education move, the girls have nevertheless played their part too, as Gap Tutor and Netball coach respectively over the last few years! It has been a privilege to be the headmaster of this wonderful school.

As you know we will be moving to Vietnam where I have accepted the position as Principal of the Kindergarten and Primary School at AIS Saigon, the Australian International School in Ho Chi Minh City. We are obviously excited about the prospect of a new beginning in a fascinating country and of the challenges that will be faced taking charge of a diverse community in an International School setting like AIS Saigon.

The staff team, children and our parent community at Waihi are, quite simply, second to none. I know that Mike Tayler and the Waihi Board will be keeping you apprised of the progress regarding their search for an exceptional candidate to take on the role of Headmaster of Waihi School. I will be staying on at Waihi at the beginning of 2025 to ensure this process is completed smoothly and that an effective handover can take place, before I start my position at AIS Saigon at the start of their Term 4 next April. I assure you all that I will be working hard to assist the Board in whatever way I can in this process.
