From the Headmaster's Desk

QUESTIONS AND QUERIES

As a school we provide a huge amount of information in the school newsletter, on our website and via various different guides and handbooks. (Please see *Waihi School helpful website links* on the front page of this newsletter). Many parents also find the Waihi Parents and Friends Facebook page a useful vehicle for asking other parents for information.

The Waihi staff team, both teaching, administration and boarding are always more than happy to assist families with questions and queries. However, each time the telephone rings it distracts staff from whichever task they are currently engaged in, often with children. It can be extremely frustrating when many calls each day could easily have been avoided had parents simply read the newsletter, or checked online for the information! Whilst it may indeed "be easier just to ring Kat", please be conscious of the work these amazing staff do and check the information provided before picking up the phone to make that call.

WEDNESDAY MORNINGS AND FRIDAY AFTERNOONS

A reminder that Wednesday mornings we have a late start to allow for our Weekly Staff Professional Learning time. One of the challenges of running a busy boarding school is that there are always staff on duty and consequently trying to organise meetings between staff can prove difficult. Groups of staff do meet early in the morning, late at night and many times in-between, but we value a regular weekly 'professional learning time' where we can gather all of our teaching staff team to discuss important educational issues and engage in professional development opportunities, without 'missing' anyone because they are on duty with the students somewhere. There are huge benefits for us to enable teaching staff to work together this way each week.

The solution we arrived at is for staff to meet from 8.00-9.00am each Wednesday morning, meaning a late start this day for the students – classes start at 9.00am. For boarders it means an extra half an hour 'sleep in' and a slightly later breakfast this day – the extra rest once a week being no bad things with many having busy weekday evenings of sport at various points throughout the year. For day students it will mean having a later (half to three-quarters of an hour) bus pick up time or drop off at school time on a Wednesday morning.

The first day for this late start is in Week 1, Wednesday 29th January 2025

Friday afternoons the school day will finish at 3.00pm. For the last couple of years, this early finish (3.00pm rather than 4.00pm) has been really beneficial, particularly in the Winter terms, to help accommodate hockey games on a Friday evening.

PREP

There are many differing opinions on the value of homework but at present we are still in the 'for' camp. We believe Prep is important for the following reasons:

- 1. At Waihi we have traditionally encouraged personal reading time each day (for pleasure), we still believe this has value and hope parents will support this at home as well as at school. Prep includes time for personal reading.
- 2. We develop independent learning skills and habits through Prep. Anecdotally, Waihians are well-prepared, compared to their peers, for this aspect of High School when they leave.
- 3. The ability to reflect and revisit work from the day can help to cement ideas covered or identify areas of misunderstanding to be followed up on. Staff will follow up on Prep to ensure it meets its purpose.

We do not believe Prep is the time to be learning new material (expect perhaps for the those older students who have highly developed independent learning skills). It can however be used for encouraging creativity and reflection.

Prep is not intended to be a negative experience for our students. Should your child at home, or indeed boarders at school, find difficulty in understanding or completing tasks in a reasonable timeframe, it is important to let the child's teacher know. Staff will always welcome feedback and will be understanding if difficulties arise.

BEING SUNSMART / SUNSAFE

TERM ONE / TERM FOUR

We wanted to remind you that all students are required to wear a school bucket hat or cap during outside play in the summer months. As we require all students to have their school sunhat in school each day, we would appreciate day families checking their child has their hat as they leave each morning. Pyne House staff will do the same for our boarders.

We know just how harmful and damaging the sun can be even on overcast days and protection for our pupils is a priority and in previous conversations there is overwhelming parental support for the sunhat policy.

This rule will be strictly enforced by staff – <u>no hat, no play</u>. We encourage the children to put on sunscreen in the morning prior to school and each classroom has a pump bottle of sunscreen that is available to pupils to top up their protection. Thank you for your support in this area.

Friday 21 February 2025

Meet the Teacher and Swimming Sports: Fri 21 Feb

Our day will start with morning tea and a brief meeting in the School Hall for all parents, followed by an opportunity for everyone to meet with their child's teacher in their classrooms. We hope that every student will have at least one parent at this event.

Lunchtime will be held as class picnics followed by Swimming Sports.

This is always a great day, and we look forward to seeing you there.







Diagnostic Reports

At the 'Meet the Teacher' event all parents will receive a short report. There will be a brief pastoral comment from your child's class teacher indicating how they have settled into Waihi life; an Attitudes and Habits report and a short diagnostic listing the results of your child's initial PAT assessments.

Whilst the majority of the first few weeks are about getting the environment in and out of the classroom right and making the students feel happy and secure in their new surroundings, there will also be a few small diagnostic tests.

Our rationale for the initial testing is threefold:

- 1. To give a baseline from which to report progress (students will have matching assessments later in the year)
- 2. To help in the initial grouping, setting and differentiating of students' learning objectives and tasks
- 3. Assisting in the identification of learning support and extension needs

FIRST EXEAT

It means temporary leave and is used to describe the one or two 'long weekends' each term in which the boarding house closes for all, thus allowing those families who live far away to take their children home for the weekend (and for the boarding house staff to have a weekend to catch their breath!)

The first of these weekends is at the end of Week 4 and as often is the case, we combine the leave weekend with a major school event. Please note the first exeat for 2025 is on Friday 21 February after our Waihi Swimming Sports.
