FROM THE HEADMASTER'S DESK

Dear Parents, Caregivers, and Friends of Waihi,

"Tell me and I forget, teach me and I may remember, involve me and I learn."

- Benjamin Franklin

Welcome to Week Five. This quote feels particularly fitting as we reflect on the past fortnight at Waihi. Whether it has been through delivering speeches, tackling regional chess tournaments, hosting visiting students, or preparing for our next outdoor adventure, our students have been actively involved in meaningful learning experiences that stretch well beyond the walls of the classroom.

There is a strong sense of momentum and purpose around the school, and it has been a joy to watch our students grow in confidence, capability, and character through it all.

Almost a third of our students took part in the Timaru–Oamaru Regional Chess Tournament at Opihi College on 1 August, and they did us proud. Waihi placed first in the Junior section (Years 5–6) and first, second, fourth, and fifth in the Intermediate section (Years 7–8), an outstanding result. Special congratulations to Fox, Arthur, and Van, who each finished first in their respective grades. The focus, sportsmanship, and strategy shown by all our players was superb.

Over the past few weeks, Waihi teams have been busy both on the road and at home. We have faced a challenging but rewarding schedule of fixtures, playing Cathedral Grammar, St Margaret's, St Andrew's, and Wellesley College. At the time of writing, we are en route to Christchurch for our annual fixture against Medbury, while our netball and girls' hockey teams are taking on Rangi Ruru and Selwyn House.

Despite the winter chill and the quick turnarounds between games, our students have played with pride, skill, and determination, representing the school superbly in every code. Whether on the netball court, football pitch, or hockey turf, the quality of play and sportsmanship has been first class.

We also had the pleasure of welcoming Hadlow School for two nights as part of their winter fixture visit. A sincere thank you to the Waihi families who opened their homes to billet students. We've heard wonderful stories of bonfires on the beach, farm adventures, and classic southern hospitality. These connections, alongside the camaraderie built on the field, are what make these exchanges so memorable.

Over the past month, our students in Years 4 to 8 have been preparing and presenting speeches as part of our annual oral language programme. The ability to speak clearly and with confidence is a key life skill and a cornerstone of leadership and learning at Waihi. Whether debating, presenting, or simply making conversation, the ability to express ideas and connect with others matters greatly. The speech competition challenges students to think critically, structure ideas clearly, and present them with poise. To all those who took part, we are very proud of you. And to the families who supported them through the process, thank you for your encouragement and time.

Finally, I want to briefly update you on the proposed changes to NCEA, announced recently by the Minister of Education. While these reforms are still under consultation, it's important to note that all current Waihi students will be affected by these changes in the years to come, with our current Year 8 cohort the first to move through the new system when they reach Year 11 in 2028.

The proposals represent a shift toward a more subject-based approach, with increased emphasis on literacy, numeracy, and clearer pathways to both tertiary education and vocational opportunities. While these changes may seem some time away, they signal a significant re-shaping of how learning and assessment will be delivered in New Zealand.

This is now a time for consultation, and I strongly encourage you to read the Ministry's proposal and have your say.


